



Table saw tenoning jig – view 1

## WOOD FOR SALE

I have approximately 1800 BF of 4/4 rough sawn (1" actual thickness) red oak lumber I would like to sell. A majority is rift sawn with some quarter sawn and plain sawn as well. I took this lumber out of the kiln last weekend. Most of the wood is 8-9" widths and 10' lengths. About 600 BF is good quarter/rift sawn with the remainder being #1 and #2 grades.

I'm asking \$3.00 per board foot for clear quarter/rift sawn and \$2.00 per board foot for the clear plain sawn. I also have some #1 common quarter sawn for \$2.00 per board foot and #1 common plain sawn and shorts (quarter, rift, and plain sawn) and that I will sell for \$1.00 to \$1.50 per board foot.

I'll sell all or part of this wood. The price for everything is \$4000.



### What's the difference between quartered and rift lumber?

A quartered board features medullary ray or "fleck" perpendicular to a grain which typically forms angles from 60 degrees to 90 degrees with the board's surface. A rift board exhibits a clean, straight, vertical grain pattern which typically forms angles from 30 to 60 degrees with the board's surface.
